There is no doubt that by any account, Mr. Hsieh was a brilliant mind. He graduated from Harvard with a degree in Computer Science. A moment of silence and respect from those of us that are not tech savvy whatsoever...

He initially worked at Oracle making a very good salary. However, quickly realizing he was not happy, he chose to strike out on his own. Coming from an entrepreneurial mindset, I can respect that decision a great deal. Too many people get stuck in a 'golden handcuff' scenario where the paycheck tames the inner drive of a person to go out on their own. Be it because of a mortgage, a family situation, the list goes on. However, there are many that choose to stay put, and there is absolutely nothing wrong with that. However, you do have to respect the individual that decides to wager on his potential and forego the paycheck for the unknown.

From there, Hsieh created a company called LinkExchange, where companies could trade marketing banners on their respective site for a fee. There again, he showed signs of great ingenuity and impeccable timing. This was the time when 'link sharing' exploded, and he was able to sell that startup two years later for a reported \$250 Million.

Most would have set off into the sunset at that point. However, he chose to continue the adventure and by happenstance, heard about this company called Zappos. It was making about \$1.6 million / year when he acquired it. When he sold it, it was valued at a little over a billion. Think about that for a moment. The incredible amount of change he was able to create during his time there. But the financial gain was only one part of the story. Zappos, during his time there, was nominated the best place to work in for years. People were given free reign to govern themselves. This created an unstoppable machine and a company culture often imitated. He will be remembered as one of America's greatest success stories.

He wasn't even done, once again. At the time of his passing, he had created a real estate hub where entrepreneurs and startups could congregate in a 'community like' housing environment in Las Vegas. He himself decided to stop living in a luxurious high rise, and chose to live among people in the community with whom he related to – entrepreneurs.

His unfortunate death was linked to smoke inhalation when he was trapped indoors as a fire broke out. The 'underground' story is that Mr. Hsieh suffered from severe drug use, and could not seem to shake off his addiction. It is a story that is too common among the greats of our times. The void they feel inside is sometimes too strong that they seek chemical escapes via drugs.

Tony Hsieh will always be remembered not only for his entrepreneurial mindset, but the amazing, selfless person he was. Dare to make history with your adventure called life!
